What We Do **How We Do It** ADR's mission is to partner with public school districts and communities to foster family literacy.

School committees select a book for Elementary School Students, with a special focus on lower-income and minority schools where the reading gap tends to be the greatest. ADR supports school administrators and teachers and sends a packet to every family with content questions and a reading schedule. A parent or caregiver reads the book aloud, chapter by chapter. Partnering activities like trivia questions and prizes are coordinated with libraries and local stores to supercharge the reading experience. The process is repeated twice each year for every student in the school division.

Where We'll Go with Your Help

Our goal is to build our program to be in more school districts and, eventually, go nationwide. To do this, we need to selectively grow our staff talent base, increase our brand awareness, and scale our program to new school districts.

ADR's fun, family approach works in diverse communities from Virginia to New York. Hampton City Schools went from a ranking of 91st to 60th in reading scores in two years...Northumberland County's third-grade reading scores went from 60% to 80% following the ADR Program.




Where We've Been
